Our Village Hall is about 13 metres long by 6 metres wide and can easily accommodate 80 people just in the Main Hall alone for conferences. For catering functions 50 people can be seated without feeling cramped. Our room on the upper level is ideal for small meetings and can hold up to 10 individuals. All of this comes with a fully fitted kitchen with ample crockery and cutlery. There are separate toilet facilities including those for disabled persons. The building is centrally heated and benefits from the usual lighting and electrical outlets combined with the added facility of BIG SCREEN TV. There is hard standing for approximately 10 vehicles and a further 20 spaces within the grounds.

History of Our Village Hall

Our Village Hall was built as a gift from Major Huth and his wife, a local couple, in 1924 with an approximate cost of £900 for the building work and the land. But it came with a stipulation! "That the building be used by the people of Inkpen on the understanding that it be not used for anti-Christian and unconstitutional purposes." There must be many a tale to be told of happenings within its walls. The stealing of bottled iam made by the Women's Institute during the war years. The echoes from a piano recital by the then famous "Solomon" on the hall piano, in aid of a War Charity. And what was said at Parish Council and other political meetings during this time? There were also Film shows, Band Fetes, Produce Shows, Harvest Suppers, Christmas parties and a host of other local events. It must have been a hive of activity and a focal point for the village. An interesting milestone was the granting of a Drink Licence in 1968. This must have come as a welcome treat to the locals after many years of having a "Dry" hall.

Our Village Hall has a wonderful history, with so much more to reveal from its past and so much more for its future.
